K&N® Cabin Air Filters replace your vehicle's stock cabin filter with a reusable design that cleans and freshens incoming air. They are electrostatically charged to grab and hold dust particles. K&N® cabin air filters help control odors while they help capture most mold, mildew, fungus, spores, bacteria and germs. When they get dirty they can be cleaned and reused and best of all, they come with a No-Hassle Lifetime Limited Warranty.

When applicable, refer to owner's manual for manufacturers installation/removal instructions. The following are helpful steps when replacing/servicing cabin air filter with K&N® cabin air filter.

Thank you for purchasing this K&N washable-reusable cabin filter. As this filter will fit numerous different applications, which will have different installation requirements, it would be virtually impossible to show instructions for all of them. As such we recommend you consult your vehicle owner's manual for the location and process for replacing the filter.

In general, the cabin air filter can be found in one of four places:

- Behind the Glove Box: Most commonly you will find the cabin air filter located behind the glove box. To access it, you must remove a small panel from the back of the box, or sometimes the whole glove box flops down and out of the way.
- Under the Hood: For many vehicles, the fresh air intake is in the windshield cowl where it's exposed to air but not the wind. To access this cabin filter, you must lift the hood and remove the plastic cover.
- Behind the Dash: A few vehicles have the cabin air filter located elsewhere in the dash. Most are somewhere on the passenger side, above or below the glove box, but a few are on the driver's side.
- In the trunk (or back); Usually in SUV's or vans equipped with a rear HVAC unit.

Most cabin air filters can be replaced in less than 15 minutes without tools, although some take a little longer and may require removing fasteners that hold the glove box or interior trim panels in place.
